

ULTIMATE BUSINESS TRAVELER'S GUIDE TO TORONTO

From client meetings to conferences, business travel is busy by nature. Time is at a premium when you're on the road for work and, at The Roehampton Hotel, we know that time spent searching for the necessities in an unfamiliar city could be better spent on more productive tasks.

Knowing where to find exactly what you need when you're on the road means less time searching and more time focusing on what's important.

IN AND OUT: TORONTO'S AIRPORTS

Pearson International Airport (YYZ): Pearson International is Canada's largest and busiest airport.

It is located 6301 Silver Dart Drive, Mississauga, and has two main terminals: Terminal 1 and Terminal 3. Make sure to confirm which terminal your airline departs from prior to arriving at the airport.

For domestic flights, you'll want to play it and safe and check in 90 minutes prior to your flight time. Make that 2 hours for international.

You've got a few options for getting to and from Pearson, including taxis and limos (about a \$60 flat rate fee from the airport to downtown), as well as Uber and Lyft and the UP Express Train, which gets you to the airport in about 25 minutes and costs around \$12.50 each way. During Toronto's busy rush hours, this might be your quickest means of transportation!

Pearson International Airport is about a 25-minute drive The Roehampton Hotel.

Billy Bishop Airport (YTZ):

Located on Toronto Island, Billy Bishop offers service to 20 cities in Canada and the US.

Located at 2 Eireann Quay, Toronto, Billy Bishop has only one main terminal. It's a small airport, so aim to check-in 60 minutes prior to your flight time.

Getting to Billy Bishop is easy and efficient. You can take the complimentary shuttle buses are available every 15 minutes from Union Station, hail an Uber or Lyft or jump on one of the TTC's (Toronto Transit Commission) streetcar lines. However you choose to get there, it's important to note that access to Billy Bishop requires the use of a short ferry ride or an underwater passenger tunnel. Account for extra travel time.

Billy Bishop is about a 20-minute drive from The Roehampton Hotel.

Located at 199 Bay Street in Toronto, Dineen is about a 15-minute drive from The Roehampton Hotel.

TORONTO TRANSPORTATION: A QUICK GUIDE TO TORONTO'S MANY TRANSPORTATION OPTIONS

Getting from A to B in a big city like Toronto can be complicated. Luckily, our booming metropolis offers easy and efficient transportation options to fit any need, at any time.



The Toronto Transit Commission (TTC)

The Toronto Transit Commission is a quick, convenient and cost-efficient way to get around Toronto. While it is a large-scale public transit system designed to serve a massive metropolis, there are some tips that can make it easy to navigate. The TTC is divided amongst three main systems: the subway, buses and streetcars.

Toronto's subway lines run North-South through the city's core, through Midtown and into Uptown, via two main lines: the University Avenue line and the Yonge Street line, which both conjoin at Toronto's Union Station.

The subway also runs East-West along Bloor Street all the way from Kipling to Scarborough.

During Toronto's busy rush hours, public transit is often the quickest means of getting around the city. From the Roehampton Hotel, the subway is the quickest means of public transit into downtown.

From The Roehampton Hotel, a quick walk west along Eglinton Avenue will bring you to Eglinton Station. From here, board the southbound train on the Yonge Line, which will take you directly into the city's core.

In addition to the subway, the TTC offers comprehensive bus and streetcar lines that connect the city.

Adult fares are \$3.25 and children under 12 ride for free. Fares are valid for transfers on directly connected routes however for second transfers and beyond, additional fares must be purchased.

If the TTC seem big and intimidating, don't worry – it offers a **Trip Planner** tool which makes plotting a journey easy.

Toronto Taxis

Catching a taxi in Toronto is unbelievably easy on account of the sheer volume of cabs available. If you're planning to call or schedule a taxi from The Roehampton Hotel, you can contact the hotel's Front Desk and our staff will be happy to schedule a taxi on your behalf.

Alternatively, you can hail a cab with a number of companies including Beck Taxi at (416) 751-5555; Co-Op Cabs at (416) 504 2667 and City Taxi at (416) 740-2222.

Uber and Lyft

Toronto boasts a selection of two ridesharing options: Uber and Lyft. These app-based services can be a cost-effective way of getting around the city. However, you should expect surge charges and wait times during high-demand periods such as rush hour, during special events and in extreme weather.
